# PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE OVERSEAS SPECIALIST SURGICAL ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALIA INC. 20th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

## 13 OCTOBER 2022

I present this brief report to the 20th Annual General Meeting of the Overseas Specialist Surgical Association of Australia (OSSAA).

The waiting is almost over for us to resume surgical team visits. It is planned that Dr Mark Moore will lead a plastics and reconstructive team to Dili in November 2022, three years since our last visit there. In the interim we have maintained close contact with our counterparts at the Timor Leste National Hospital. And the on-line training and exchange of ideas has continued. Of special note was the awarding of the John Hargrave Scholarship to Cornelio Maria Mok Freitas to enable him to complete his Bachelor Degree in Nursing. Mok has worked with OSSAA team members for many years to improve the standards of surgical care in Timor-Leste.

Return visits to Cancar in eastern Indonesia remain under consideration.

Since OSSAA's establishment in March 2002 there have been 112 trips, 12,032 consultations and 5,379 surgical procedures carried out by our volunteer teams.

The James Bond Film, *No time to die*, was a winner in November. Our mid-year luncheon was held in July 2022 and we were privileged to have Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson, Governor of South Australia as our guest speaker.
